

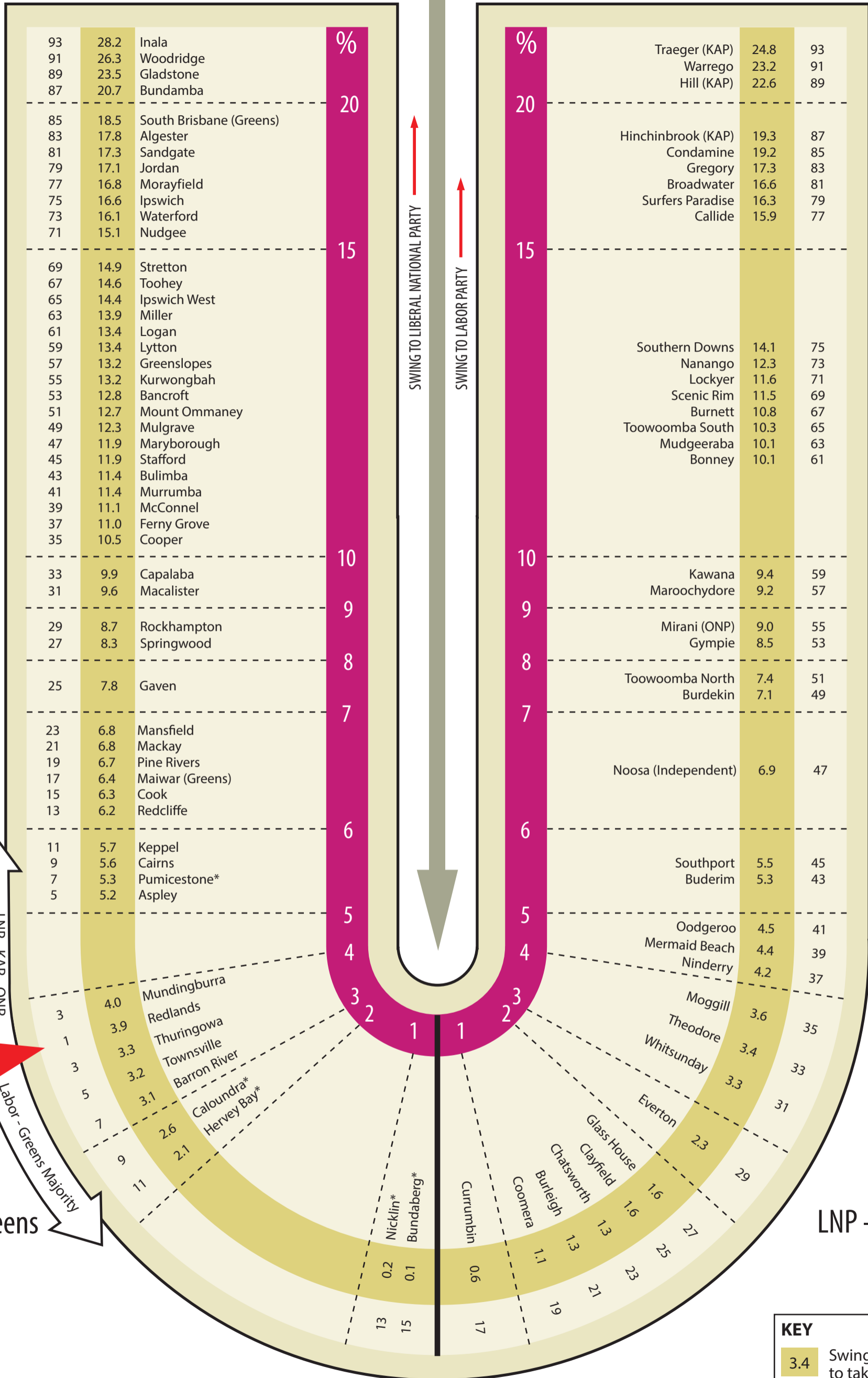

## Counts not conventional for two-party preferred vote

### Seat won by Katter's Australian Party – Hinchinbrook

Nick Dametto (KAP)	19,064	64.76%
Scott Piper (LNP)	10,374	35.24%
Swing needed by LNP:	14.8%	

Note: On my November 2017 reverse side of the pendulum the LNP needed a swing of 7.6%. Therefore, the swing to KAP in 2020 was 7.2%.

### Seat won by Independent member Ms Sandy Bolton – Noosa

Sandy Bolton (Independent)	21,065	65.85%
James Blevin (LNP)	10,925	34.15%
Swing needed by LNP:	15.9%	

Note: On my November 2017 reverse side of the pendulum the LNP needed a swing of 11.6%. Therefore, the swing to Ms Sandy Bolton in 2020 was 4.3%.

### Second seat won by The Greens – South Brisbane

Amy Macmahon (The Greens)	18,450	55.35%
Jackie Trad (Labor)	14,886	44.65%
Swing needed by Labor:	5.4%	

Note: On my November 2017 reverse side of the pendulum Amy Macmahon of The Greens needed a swing of 3.6% to take the seat from Labor's Jackie Trad. Therefore, the swing to Amy Macmahon of The Greens in 2020 was 8.9%.

Notes:

- (n) Refers to cases where the two-party preferred count was normal, Labor in the left-hand column, Liberal National in the right-hand column. The 65 electoral districts excluded from the table (for reasons of lack of space) are all of this type of count.
- (a) Refers to the two cases where the two-party preferred count was between Labor and One Nation. Thus in Bundamba the Labor winner received 21,507 votes where the one Nation loser received 8,922 votes.
- (b) Refers to the three cases where the two-party preferred count was between Labor and KAP. That was actually the case in Hill and Traeger. In Hinchinbrook, by contrast, the count was between KAP and LNP with KAP getting 19,064 votes and LNP 10,374. So whereas LNP needs a swing of 14.8% my estimate is that Labor needs a swing of 19.3% to take the seat from KAP.
- (c) Refers to the two cases of seats won by The Greens where the count was between LNP and Greens. That was actually the case in Maiwar. In South Brisbane, by contrast, the count was between Greens and Labor with Macmahon getting 18,450 votes and Trad 14,886. So whereas Labor needs a swing of 5.4% the LNP needs an estimated swing of 18.5% to take the seat from The Greens.
- (d) Refers to the unique case where the final count included an independent, Ms Sandy Bolton who won the seat. The LNP needs a swing of 15.9% to take it. My two-party preferred count is my estimate between Labor and LNP. Labor, therefore, is shown to need a swing of 6.9% to take the seat from a notional LNP member.
